### A: The story

Project name:	Printing face shields for medical personnel.
Responsible organization and person(s):	Due to project length and work being split into different aspects (promotion, finances, maintenance etc. ) the project was coordinated by a group of people – volunteers from Pomeranian ZHP Region (Patrycja Misiołek, Weronika Guz, Dawid Schwann, Mateusz Okła; Katarzyna Musyt Łanowska)
Introduction to the project:	None of us expected the events that unfolded before us at the beginning of March 2020 due to appearance of first cases of coronavirus infection in the country and in Pomeranian voivodeship. Group of adult scouts – leaders of the Polish Scouting and Guiding Association answered the call from the medical personnel. We have divided our work into three fields: sewing masks, helping elderly and those in need of basic shopping and printing face shields. The need and number of inquiries have exceeded our expectations. To match those needs we applied for FOSE funding to be able to continuously deliver face shields and continue our work.
Objectives and goals:	1.Printing and distribution of face shields for medical facilities in the region including hospitals, nursing homes, mental nursing homes and hospices, for paramedics and other medical personnel in the city and the region. 2.Aiding the elderly, lonely people form the Covid19 risk group and quarantined people with their day to day needs including but not limited to shopping for groceries, shopping for meds, taking care of pets (walking dogs, veterinary visits etc.), tutoring for kids.
To which extent did we meet objectives and goals:	With the support from FOSE the project realization turned out to be a great success. Thanks to extra resources we had an opportunity to purchase more filament for printing and we were able to maintain printers in ready to work shape. We worked with our adult volunteers and we implemented well the idea of service during this time. All above enabled us to deliver the face shields and help faster and in bigger quantities and thus support medics, health centre works and hospice workers.
What did we learn from the project:	The project significantly developed competences of volunteers working on it especially we strengthened the feeling of service, being needed more than ever, as an important part of scout day-by-day work. Thanks to continuous work of around 100 volunteers in different parts of project we were able to print, pack and ship around 8000 ready-to-



	use face shields. Our work proved and strengthened view on scouting by people as a reliable and dependable organization.
